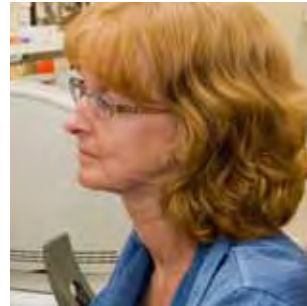

We are very pleased to present Littleton Regional Hospital's 2011 Annual Report.

Littleton Regional Hospital (LRH) had another very good year as we continue to focus our energy on the improvement of core quality measures, patient satisfaction, employee relations and physician recruitment. We have also worked very hard at continuing to move forward with our building campaign. We were successful in relocating our Outpatient Rehabilitation Services from our downtown location to our main hospital campus, as well as our Patient Financial Services Department which is so much more convenient for our patients to access.

As we reflect on our accomplishments, the most important piece of our success is our ability to recruit and retain our physicians. In this Annual Report you will see that we have highlighted some of our local physicians so that you can get a better understanding of them on a more personal level as well as a professional level.

We have continued to recruit for specialty services here at LRH in order to augment our existing primary care services. Our goal is to grow services here locally so that you, our customers, don't have to drive elsewhere for your healthcare needs.

In the area of physician recruitment, we are very pleased to have recruited a new Urologist, Richard Caesar, MD, to LRH. Dr. Caesar brings with him over twenty years of experience of treating both pediatric and adult patients. He is fellowship trained in pediatric urology and we are very pleased to be able to expand our urology services with a newly recruited, full-time physician. We added a new Sleep Lab led by Dr. Joseph DellaValla. We are continuing recruitment for Pulmonology, Rheumatology, Dermatology and additional Internal Medicine physicians as we continue to meet the needs of the communities and region that we serve here in the North Country.

We understand that our patients want to receive their care locally, as well as have their providers be the people who are their neighbors and their friends, people they can trust. That is who our physicians are.



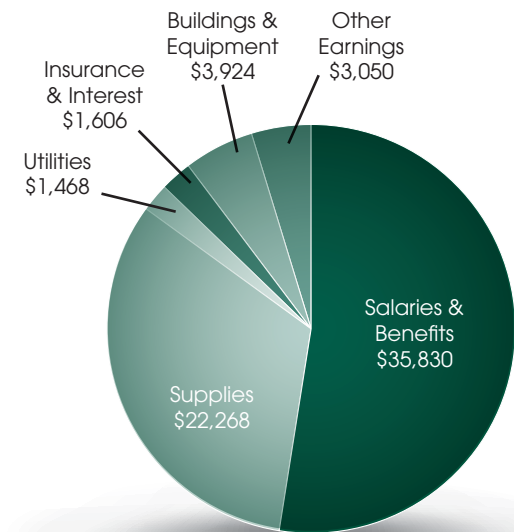
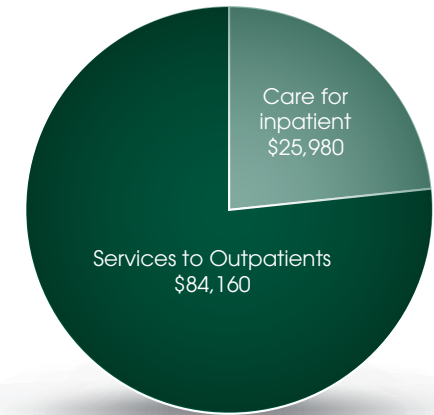

MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS A 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization, LRH consistently provides additional free or charity care and wellness/health education programs in order to meet the growing healthcare needs of our North Country community.

The Care-A-Van traveled 34,277 miles in 2011 providing transportation to and from LRH for 177 unduplicated clients with more than 3,241 trips at no charge to the patient.



NEW TECHNOLOGY AT LRH

The Diagnostic Imaging (X-Ray) Department at Littleton Regional Hospital has a long and distinguished history of providing the full range of imaging services, from traditional X-rays to state-of-the-art scanning procedures. For more than a century, a highly trained team of diagnostic radiologists uses sophisticated techniques to create images of the entire body and its organs. Those images are often critical in diagnosing and treating patient injuries, diseases, and disorders.

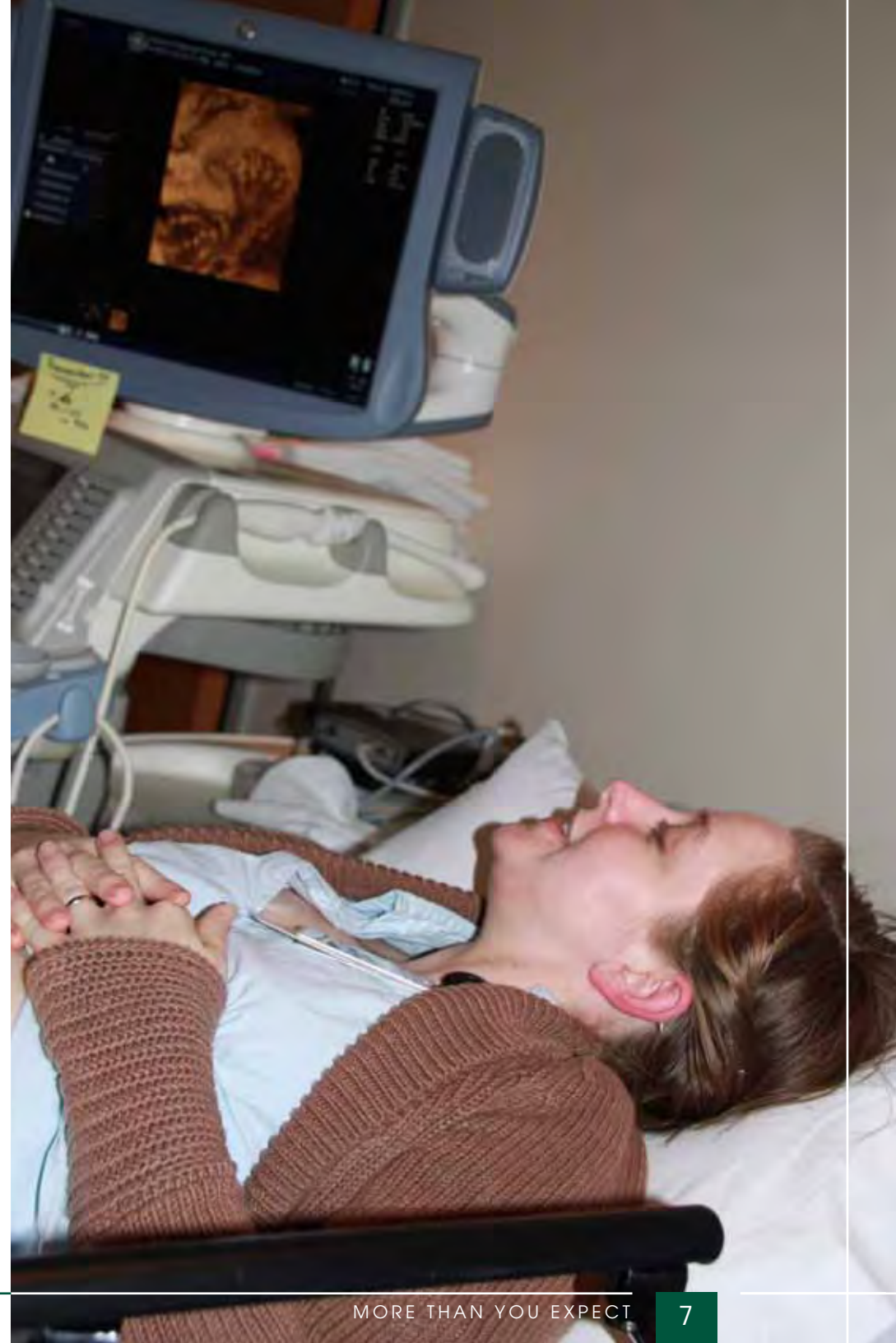
Most recently, LRH improved the ultrasound capabilities by adding a new GE LOGIQ® 9-ultrasound system probe designed to get patients in and out of the exam room faster than ever before.

This new technology helps clinicians at LRH quickly and precisely perform a variety of ultrasound exams from abdominal and breast to vascular imaging. LRH radiological clinicians can sweep the ultrasound transducer over a patient's body to collect the image information needed. With this new volume of image data, the clinician is able to virtually do additional analysis and create a variety of images of the anatomy of concern after patients at LRH have left their physicians office.

LRH can now re-scan to create 4-D (4 dimensional) views, analyze high-resolution views of the anatomy, or apply special reading effects without patients having to be there or return for additional exams. This will reduce patient visits, as well as be beneficial for extremely sick patients or those with difficulties when being scanned.

The new LOGIQ® 9-ultrasound probe provides a clearer picture to view, and assists patients to gain a better understanding of what they are looking at when their physician explains the results of the ultrasound. LRH clinicians have the freedom to perform multiple tasks simultaneously, helping patients at LRH become more comfortable during and after the ultrasound exam.

I married a Pennsylvania man and practiced there for two years, before we decided that northern New Hampshire seemed a pretty much ideal place to settle and raise a family.

IMPROVING PATIENT CARE WITH INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

On October 1, 2011, LRH went “live” with a new health information management system from McKesson/Paragon, with a goal of providing physicians and nurses with better access to clinical information. LRH replaced a 20-year-old health information management system that did not provide the added patient safety features that the new McKesson/Paragon system provides. LRH is one of a growing number of community hospitals in the country to introduce electronic health records as part of an enhanced health information system.

Paragon is an integrated hospital information system (HIS) designed specifically to meet the clinical and financial needs of community hospitals. After much consideration and research, LRH chose this system because it also serves as a foundation for a complete community hospital solution enhanced with a number of applications.

What is next for LRH in Information Technology?

Over the next twelve months, LRH will continue to install components to the McKesson/Paragon system including Computerized Physician Order Entry (CPOE), Physician Documentation and Horizon Patient Folder and Horizon Business Folder – each playing a vital role in health information management for patients at LRH.

What is Computerized Physician Order Entry (CPOE)?

Instead of jotting medical orders (for nursing care, labs, medications or radiology exams) on a piece of paper or giving orders over the phone, LRH physicians will be able to enter and access orders directly from LRH’s computer system that will immediately transmit the order to the person who will carry them out.

The use of CPOE will improve the quality of patient care by reducing errors and enhancing the continuity of care throughout a patient’s stay at LRH and beyond.

How CPOE Benefits Patients at LRH

- Physicians’ orders can be carried out faster.
- Automatically updates patient data in a single, secure electronic health record.
- Faster order turnaround (including medication and STAT lab results).
- Will minimize any chance of an order being misread or medications being confused due to similarity in names.
- Ensures patient information is readily available to authorized members of the patient-care team.
- Greatly improves patient safety, which is why LRH chose this quality system.

Physician Documentation and Horizon Patient Folder

Physicians at LRH will be able to sign-on with the HorizonWP® Physician Portal Web gateway. This will provide LRH physicians with secure access including inpatient and outpatient information, as well as personalized views according to their workflow needs. As a patient, you can rest assured that your information is up-to-date, accurate and will be shared with the appropriate member of the care team at LRH.

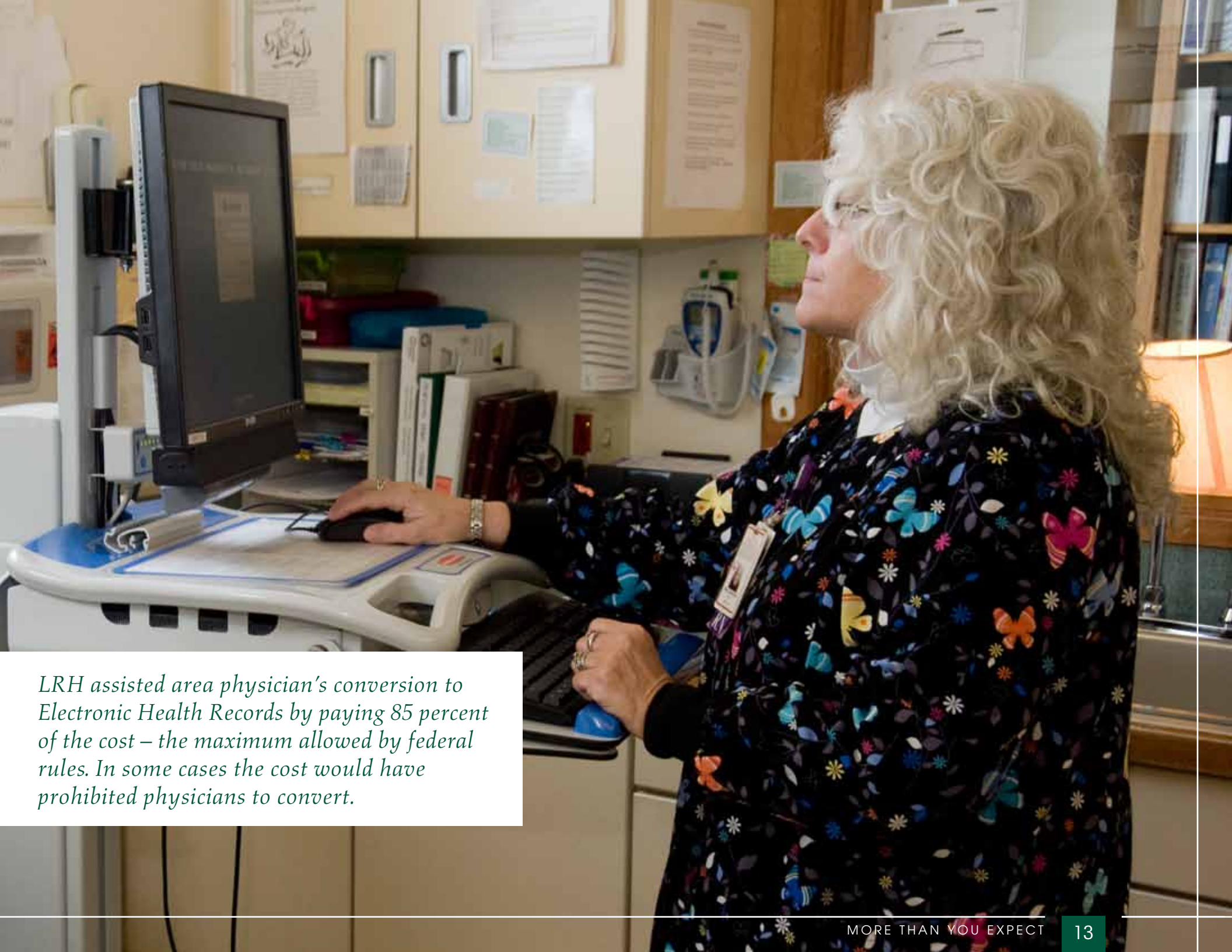
Horizon Business Folder

Horizon Business Folder™ document management system automates and streamlines the business office processes of the patient financial services department, and will assist Littleton Regional Hospital manage claims documentation, remittance advices, and other documentation more effectively and efficiently.

How will the Horizon Business Folder help patients at LRH?

The Horizon Business Folder will assure accurate and complete medical care claim submissions, and will reduce denials from your insurance carrier resulting from technical billing errors, as well as insufficient clinical documentation. This component will provide financial responsibility to patients before service is delivered.

With this enhanced health information management system in place, physicians, nurses, and clinicians at LRH can collaborate in real-time to provide care that is safer, more efficient, and of higher quality. LRH can now support patient centered care regardless of the number of physicians who treat patients. Elderly patients will no longer need to carry around their prescriptions in a bag or have a family member present to update their multiple physicians on their medications or conditions. Patients at LRH will be able to focus on getting well without worrying about the accuracy of their health information.



LRH assisted area physician's conversion to Electronic Health Records by paying 85 percent of the cost – the maximum allowed by federal rules. In some cases the cost would have prohibited physicians to convert.

This year, the Auxiliary donated over \$24,000 to LRH and the surrounding community. The following is a list of recipients:



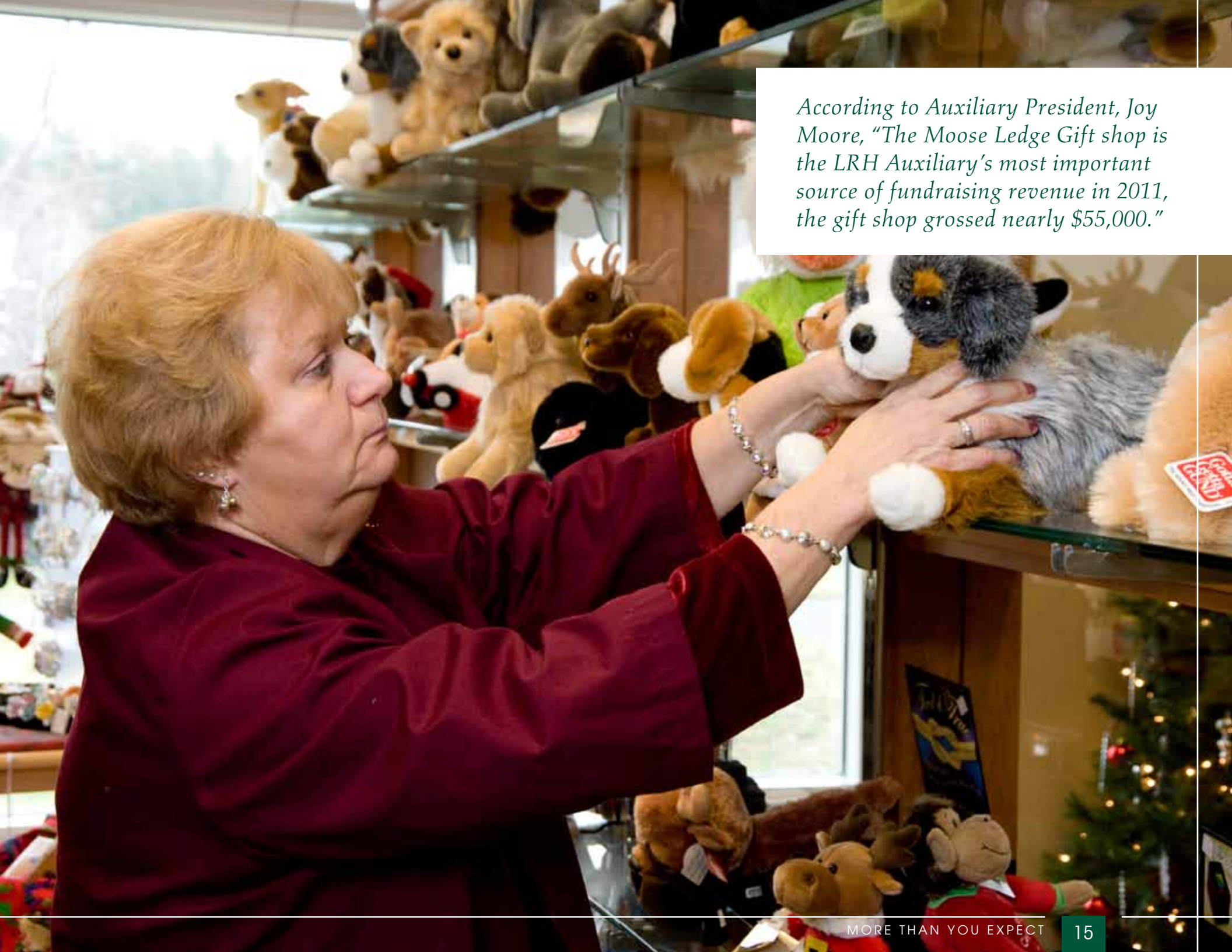

For more than 105 years, the generosity of our community has been an integral part of enriching the programs and services offered at Littleton Regional Hospital, allowing us to provide high-quality, affordable healthcare.

This year the community supported several programs, services and equipment needs for LRH including:

- Supporting the development of a nursing education website.
